OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Brown stated the Town will finish the current year, then decide on a payroll company before budget time.

Supervisor Brown reported that SPDES renewals have been signed and sent to NYSDEC.

The Town will contact residents and property owners on the newly named Schrantz Drive, and will request permission to place E-911 signs.

NEW BUSINESS

Councilwoman Goode asked about residents that wish to donate funds for a commemorative park bench, Supervisor Brown noted that is an option.

Supervisor Brown gave an overview of the Green Cemetery, which is now considered defunct. The New York State Cemetery Board has asked for assistance is reorganizing the cemetery. The Town will host a meeting of interested plot owners on May 9. The owners may establish a new Cemetery Board by appointing a committee, and new Board could be elected that night. If there is no interest, or no Board is elected, the Town Board can take over the Cemetery.

MOTION was made by Councilman Musall, seconded by Councilwoman Goode to support the reorganization of the Green Cemetery Board. All in agreement.

Resident Bob Patterson announced plans are being made for a second annual Town Picnic at the KillBuck Park and Pavilion on August 4. A meeting will be held May 1 at 7:00 pm at the park, with a rain location at the KillBuck FireHall.
