MOTION was made by Councilman Musall, seconded by Councilwoman Kruszynski to accept the Supervisor's Report for March. All in agreement.

OLD BUSINESS

Attorney Sorgi read a letter that can be sent to escrow companies by taxpayers to explain this cycle's error, and how it will be fixed.

Supervisor Brown explained the fine from the DEC, which is due to a portion of the original SPEDS form being left blank in case of sewer spill at BonnVal and Fairview Lands, both of which have sand filters for septic treatment. The proper paperwork has been filed, but DEC still maintains the Town should pay a fine.

MOTION was made by Supervisor Brown, seconded by Councilman Musall to authorize the Supervisor to sign the DEC paperwork, but crossing out the fine, as advised by the Attorney Sorgi. All in agreement.

Town Clerk read a letter from NYS DOT acknowledging receipt of speed study request, and stating the request for US Route 219 will be investigated.

NEW BUSINESS

Supervisor Brown noted work has begun on the Martin Road Bridge.

AUDIT
