MINUTES

BONNVAL WATER/SEWER

Eric Wohlers gave an overview of the plan for the water system, which involves filter changes and rebuilding the valves, due to the age of the system being 18 years, with an estimated life of 20 years.

MOTION was made by Supervisor Brown, seconded by Councilman Musall to authorize MDA Engineers to draw up specifications for bids to have the work done as advised by Catt. Co. Health Department, and include a small storage shed/addition that is heated and vented to store the chlorine. All in agreement.

MOTION was made by Councilman Musall, seconded by Councilwoman Kruszynski to hire Bob Scharf to oversee the operation of the current set-up, and the implementation of the planned upgrades at an hourly rate of \$50/hour. All in agreement.

Inaccuracies in the tax assessments at BonnVal have been corrected. Pat Martin thanked the Supervisor, the Board and Tom Dineen for the responsiveness with the water/sewer issues.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Due to issues with receiving specific requested reports from the Berry's, we still have no Supervisors or Financial Reports.

TOWN HALL ROOF

MOTION was made by Councilwoman Goode, seconded by Councilwoman Kruszynski to request bids for the Town Hall Roof Replacement. Councilman Musall will write specs. All in agreement.
